**INCIDENT:** A White Volvo C70 parked through a valet service was subsequently reported stolen from the HPD NE Parking Lot on the Main Campus. The Davie Police Department and the NSU Public Safety Department are investigating this crime.

**CRIME PREVENTION: HOW TO PROTECT YOUR CAR**

Many auto thefts are crimes of "opportunity". Leaving the keys in your car (even a "hidden" spare key) greatly increases your chances of having your car stolen.

- Don't leave your keys in your car.
- Close your windows and lock your doors whenever you leave your car, regardless of how long you plan to be gone.
- Park in well-lit areas.
- Keep your car in a garage if you have one.
- Park in lots that have attendants.
- When parking your car, turn your wheels toward the curb to make it more difficult for a thief to "tow" your car.
